

## Sallie B. Howard School Announces Plan for Meal Assistance During COVID-19 School Closing

(WILSON, N.C.) – March 30, 2020 – In an effort to address the needs of families who rely on the daily meals served during school, Sallie B. Howard School (SBHS) has announced plans to provide breakfast and lunch to students during the state-mandated COVID-19 school closure.

Beginning Tuesday, April 7 (following our scheduled Spring Break), SBHS will serve breakfast and lunch to-go meals to students on weekdays between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. Both meals will be packaged together and available for pick-up in the school parking lot.

Parents can reserve their child's meals online at salliebhowardschool.com or by calling the school at (252) 293-4150 between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. An SBH student number must be provided in the reservation form in order to receive a meal. This service will continue for the duration of the state-imposed school closure. Parents will need to reserve meals online prior to each week.
